AYUTTHAYA

The successor to Sukhothai in becoming the capital of Siam. Ayutthaya was the capital from 1350 – 1767 and is just a 1 hour 30 mins drive from Bangkok. Here are some places of attractions to visit in Ayutthaya;

Wat Chaiwatthanaram

One of Ayutthaya's most impressive temples, the Khmer style Wat Chaiwatthanaram is a Royal temple that was used by the King and other members of the Royal family. There are 120 sitting Buddha statues dotted around the area; originally thought to have been painted black and gold, they now sit dressed in orange drapery, creating a peaceful, picturesque scene

Ayutthaya Historical

Designated as a UNESCO World Heritage Site and is comprised of 67 stunning temples and ruins. The huge area includes the former Siamese capital city, with imposing Buddha statues set within a serene and striking landscape of blue skies and greenery.

Wat Phra Mahthat

Comprised of a large stone Buddha head set in a colossal and deep-rooted tree. Exactly how the head became locked in its present location is unclear. This place is the most photographed spot in Ayutthaya, so you should take one here too. **Special Highlights**

THE CAPITAL CITIES OF SIAM

The Capital Cities of Siam

Everyone knows the capital city of Thailand, which is Bangkok. But did you know that it was not the first capital city of Thailand/Siam. Let us bring you to the 3 capital cities of Siam and what place you should visit there.



BANGKOK

Bangkok became the capital of Siam (as Thailand was previously known) in 1782, when General Chao Phraya Chakri, the founder of the ruling Chakri dynasty, assumed the throne as Rama I and is still the capital till now. There are a lot of places to visit Bangkok, but here are some historic places to consider next time in Bangkok;



The Grand Palace

No trip to Bangkok will be complete without visiting this place. The official residence of The King from 1782, this place is majestic with its architecture and history. It also houses one of the most impressive temples in Bangkok, the temple of the Emerald Buddha or known as Wat Phra Kaew

Wat Arun

Also called the Temple of Dawn, this temple is easily accessible by boat through the Chao Phraya River and greets your sight majestically from the boat. It is directly opposite Wat Pho, so taking a boat tour is highly recommended.

SUKHOTHAI

This was the capital of the Thai Empire from 1238 – 1278

AD. Literally meaning 'Dawn of Happiness', Sukhothai is a
6-hour drive from Bangkok and is somewhat like the middle
point between Bangkok and Chiang Mai. This ancient kingdom is now designated as a UNESCO World Heritage Site.
Here are some places to visit whenever in Sukhothai.



Sukhothai Histrorical Park

This historical park was an initiative to preserve the history of Sukhothai. There a lot of places to visit in this historical park such as ancient ruins, temples and museum. It'll take you the whole day to tour around. For a little more exercise, you can choose to bike around the historical park and take the sights at a leisurely pace.

Wat Maha That

The very heart and largest temple in the park, you cannot miss this temple when here in Sukhothai. Inside the temple is a grand pagoda that surrounds by another 8 pagodas as if they are a lotus. There were about 200 chedis at their best, although only some are well preserved till today. It is an impressive place to visit.

Muang Boran (Ancient City)

Want to experience the whole of ancient Thailand in one day, why not visit the Ancient City. Muang Boran just outside Bangkok is an outdoor museum in Samut Prakan covering 96 hectares or 240 acres with scaled models or replicas of ancient city ruins and historical monuments from various parts of Thailand. There are 116 scaled models or replicas of ancient ruins, monuments, buildings, and structures that sum up the ethnic and cultural heritage of Thailand.

LOCAL SPORT FOR THRILL-SEEKING

Muay Thai

Muay Thai is the most passionately followed sport in Thailand and this ancient martial art has been handed over from generation to generation. This martial art uses kicking and punching in a ring. The hands, shins, elbows, and knees are used extensively. Even known as the most fierce and furious battling, Muay Thai indeed is one of the most exciting to watch.



Takro

Takro or takraw is a sport that played throughout Southeast Asia including Thailand. This sport is traditionally played in a loosely formed circle of people who use feet, knees, thighs, chests, and shoulders to pass the woven rattan ball. In Thailand, takro is played during leisure time or at festivals such as Songkran. Modern takro or takraw use the net in which the light rattan ball is knocked from team to team. Thailand has a team that most respected among its peers.



Kite Fighting

Thais generally fly kites during the hot seasons, from March to May. Kites have been enjoyed since the 13th and 14th -century Sukhothai period. Those kites design differently for display and for fighting. For the latter, the opposing teams will fly male Chula and female Pakpao kites in a battle of the sexes.

Football

Football is one of the mostwatched and played sport in the world. In Thailand, this popular sport has supporters of both sexes and the national team in several competitions on the world level. Thailand has many notable football players, and this sport has created competitiveness among active clubs in Thailand. Golf

FOOD WAS FAMOUS BY REGION IN **THAILAND**

Thailand has some amazing food, right? By some, we meant a lot. Famous worldwide for its cuisine and gastronomy, Thailand has a lot to offer. Here are some food famous in regions around Thailand.



NORTHEASTERN REGION

Thailand's Northeast Region, or Isan, is famous for its grilled meats, sticky rice, strong fermented salads, and heaped plates of fresh vegetables and herbs. Isan kitchen table is represented with spicy, sweet, salty, and sour flavors. Famous dishes from this region are Kai Yang (barbecued chicken), Som Tam (green papaya salad), Lap (spicy ground meat or fish), dishes that are usually served with sticky glutinous rice.





SOUTHERN REGION



A majority Muslim populace region, southern cuisines shares flavours from its neighbours, particularly Malaysia and Indonesia. Trademark flavors from this regions are powerful with spiciness being highlighted usually. Famous dishes from this region are Kaeng Tai Pla (fermented fish curry), Kaeng Som Pla (hot and sour fish soup), and Kua Kling (dry fried meat curry). Massaman, a stewed curry of meat and potatoes, is another key specialty.



NORTHERN REGION





Centered around Chiang Mai, this region is famous for its Lanna Cuisine. Usually starts off the meal with am Phrik Ong / Nam Phrik Num (chilli dips) with raw or boiled vegetables is an appetizer to get your taste bud stimulating. The most famous dish in this region is undoubtedly Khao Soi, (curried noodles). Flavour and texture contrasts dominate a red and yellow coconut curried broth, and crunchy noodles are piled on top of the soft noodles with succulent chicken leg meat layered underneath it.

CENTRAL REGION

The cuisine of this region is what hits the closes to the visitors as Thai food. With Bangkok at its heart, and rich fertile soil and river fish, this region is home to Jasmine rice, a staple food. Famous dishes from this region are Phat Thai, and also the birthplace of Kaeng Khiao Wan (green curry), and the equally loved Tom Yam Kung (hot and sour shrimp soup. Both are deliciously eaten with rice.
