### And if you miss Thailand, here is good news!

The new announcement from the Royal Thai government regarding quarantine for foreigners visiting Thailand from 1st April 2021 onwards, it will be more relaxing. If the visitor has Vaccine Certificate (VC) and Covid-19 Free Certificate (CFC), the quarantine time will only be 7 days. But if the visitor only has CFC, the quarantine time will be 10 days.

We hope travelling will back to normal very soon, Thailand is waiting for you all.

## HISTORICAL EXPLORING IN THAILAND

### **CHIANG MAI**

A laid-back, relaxing city turns into a big festival during Songkran. Celebrated in the northern Lanna style, enjoy water splashes and festivities across the city. The best spots are at the Thapae Gate and also Nimmanhaemin Road.

Here are a few best places to celebrate Songkran Festival:



### **BANGKOK**

Although the city may be a little bit quieter than the norm, as the city folks take the opportunity to return to their hometown, the festivities are a different story. Get your water guns ready for a big water fight as the city will usually host a big water festival for Songkran. The must-go spots are Khao San Road and Silom Road.





### **AYUTTHAYA**

The ancient capital of Siam, Ayutthaya is full of historical sites and attractions. Marking the Songkran celebration here quite a unique experience. A place where Songkran is celebrated with historical backgrounds is an absolute camera worthy to remember.

### **PATTAYA**

Unlike other places, Pattaya's Songkran festivals end at a later date which is on 19th April due to the Wan Lai Festival. Meaning that the water festivals get a longer duration if you visit Pattaya during Songkran. While there in Pattaya, do visit Bang Saen for amazing sand sculptures on the beach.



Famous for its nightlife, Songkran turns Phuket into an all-day water party. Enjoy the island during Songkran is especially fun when the water splashing helps us cool down during the scorching weather. The best spots in Phuket are in Patong area and Phuket Town.

Thais have always chosen to live by the water and commute by boat, especially in the central and western provinces due to the topography being mainly lowland. Trade began around the water because it was convenient to transport goods around floating markets and getting things to consumers. Let's explore the charms of the old city of Thailand;





#### **Amphawa Floating Market**

This floating market is one of the top Samut Songkhram's tourist attractions. It is not far from Bangkok, every Friday-Sunday the market will be packed by the tourists who come to enjoy Canal-side views or having delicious Food. the visitors can have a boat tour to see views and lifestyles along Amphawa Canal.

### **Bang Nok Kwaek Old Market**

A small market consisting of rows of shops built along the bank of Mae Khlong River. Although small in size, this place brimming with friendliness and charms with delicious street food.



#### ha Kha Floating Marke

This floating market has managed to keep a natural atmosphere of simple suburban life where villagers' main occupation is agriculture. The floating market was a meeting place for people from the community and outsiders came to socialize.





## **Chantaboon Waterfront Community**

This 300-year-old community was the center of trade and important commercial district back when boats were the main transportation. Today, it is being restored as a cultural tourist destination, highlighting its old-world charm, architectures, old houses and buildings.



## **Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception Church**

This Roman Catholic church featuring gothic architecture is located on the west side of Chantaburi River, opposite from Chantaboon Waterfront Community. It is the religious center for Catholic Vietnamese migrants residing in Chantaburi. Both interior and exterior of the building are beautifully decorated in classic style.



### Yor Island

Located in the middle of Songkhla lake with Tinsulanonda Bridge connecting it to Songkhla City and Singh Nakhon District.

Although just a small island, it is surrounded by paved road for visitors to travel around to view interesting attractions.



### Songkhla's Old City


Along the three roads, Nakhon Nok, Nakhon Chai and Nakhon Ngam, this area is home to beautiful old-age architectures and houses that tell stories of Songkhla's bygone era. There are many things to see, such as street arts, classic Sino-Portuguese buildings, and traditional Hokkien Chinese style shop-houses.

### Old Wooden Houses on Chai Khong Road, Chiang Khan

Chiang Khan is a small, quiet city situated beside Mae Khong River where local residents live simple lives in a Thai way. Some of the old houses built along the Mae Khong riverbanks are still in their original form. From late morning until afternoon, tourists would come by to admire old houses and the atmosphere of the area.



### Si Khun Muang Temple, Chiang Khan

An ancient temple of Chiang Khan, situated on Chao Khong Road which runs parallel to Mae Khong River. This temple is both the epicenter of people's faith and a center of art.




