Rediscover Southern Thailand

Malaysia has selectively reopened its land border with Thailand on 1st April 2022 with Bukit Kayu Hitam (Kedah) - Sadao (Songkhla) and Wang Kelian (Perlis) – Wang Prachan (Satun) to fully vaccinate travelers after being closed for more than 2 years.

Since then all borders between Malaysia – Thailand gradually opens for tourists whose prefer to travel by land to these southern destinations of Thailand. Malaysia-Thailand land borders are;

- 2. Padang Besar, Perlis Pa-dang Besa, Songkhla
- 3. Bukit Kayu Hitam, Kedah Dannok-Sadao, Songkhla
- 4. Durian Burung (Kota Putra), Kedah Ban Prakob, Songkhla
- 5. Pengkalan Hulu, Perak Betong, Yala
- 6. Rantau Panjang, Kelantan Sungai Golok, Narathiwat
- 7. Bukit Bunga, Kelantan Buketa, Narathiwat
- 8. Pengkalan Kubor, Kelantan Tak Bai, Narathiwat


Songkhla



Thailand Muslim Friendly Destination

Muslims made up about 5 percent of the population in Thailand. Islam is the largest religious minority and is concentrated mostly in the southernmost provinces of Thailand. Most cities within Thailand have access to halal features such as halal-certified restaurants and prayer rooms within hotels, airports, shopping malls, and mosques all over Thailand. When traveling to Thailand, southern destinations are the main places to find all the halal needs. However you can travel beyond the southern to enjoy Thailand while not overlook halal requirements.

PATTANI

Pattani, a southern province in Thailand contains two major rivers, the Tani and Sai Buri, and covers a relatively flat region with a long coastline that runs 170 kilometers along the Gulf of Thailand. It is a Muslim dominant population with its uniqueness in language as people there speak Pattani-Malay. Which sounds and is very similar to our Kelantanese Dialect.



VISIT THE KRUE SE MOSQUE AND PATTANI CENTRAL MOSQUE

The Krue Se Mosque is built with Middle Eastern influence and built during the reign of King Naresuan the Great (1578-1593). The uniqueness about this mosque is that its most important part, the big dome roof was never completed. The Pattani Central Mosque is built with architectural design similar to the Taj Mahal in India and makes it one of the biggest and most beautiful mosque in Thailand.

VISIT BAN PASEYAWO

A famous fisherman village in Pattani, producing the best budu fish sauce in the area. But what makes it more famous is a fisherman's boat called the Kolae boat. This type of boat has been used by the fishermen of Pattani and Narathiwat for centuries. The distinctive characteristics of the Kolaeboat include the narrowing of both the bow and the stern and its colorful decoration. Besides the life-size boats, the villagers of Ban Paseyawo also make miniature versions as souvenirs.



KAO MOK

Known also as the Thai yellow briyani, this food is synonymous with Muslim Thai food. The rice can be matched with many different ingredients such as seafood and the more famous one, Chicken (Gai). Be sure not to miss it.

TRAT

The allure of this Eastern province lies in its archipelago of 52 islands within the Mu Ko Chang National Park. The quiet provincial capital of Trat on the other hand is famous for its gemstone markets both in and out of the town. This combination allows a few local communities to be built which should be experienced by travelers.

The islands provide beautiful, pristine emerald seas with their idyllic sandy beaches. A lot of islands to choose from like Ko Chang, Ko Kut, Ko Mak, Ko Kham, Ko Rang, Ko Kradat, etc. This island in hand provides many sea activities such as snorkeling, scuba diving, and more.

VISIT LOCAL COMMUNITIES

The local communities there are known for their tworeligion and three-culture community. Originally, Thai Buddhists, due to trade in the past and also because of the war, the Chinese and also the Khmer Muslims settled down along the canals there. Two communities that you should visit are Ban Nam Chiao and Ban Laem Makham.

Located about 65km or an hour's drive from Bangkok, this destination is great for a day trip or maybe to spend one night in.
