THAILAND REOPENING



Ouarantine Free Thailand Reopening

The Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) would like to confirm that Thailand is all set to welcome fully vaccinated foreign visitors, including returning Thais and foreign residents, from the approved countries/ territories to enter the Kingdom by air with no quarantine requirements from 1 November, 2021.





How to Register for "Thailand Pass"

Required Documents

- 1. Passport
- 2. COVID-19 vaccination certificate
- 3. COVID-19 insurance
- 4. Accommodation reservation (ASQ or SHA+)
- 5. Copy of visa (if a visa is necessary)









For more information, kindly contact the nearest Embassy and/or at their websites.

Registration Process

- 1. Apply for Thailand Pass with required documents at least 7 days before traveling;
- 2. Approval process by DDC will take 3-5 days.

After approval, an e-mail will be sent to applicant with QR Entry Code or Thailand Pass ID.



When Traveling to Thailand

- *Before traveling from their port of origin, visitors are required to show their negative RT-PCR test.
- * When arriving in Thailand, there will be a COVID-19 test again.
- * After that, visitors are allowed to travel.





Quarantine-Free Entry Requirements

- Travel by air from the approved countries/territories
- A Thailand Pass QR Code applied via https://tp.consular.go.th/ from 1 November, 2021
- A negative RT-PCR lab result was issued no more than 72 hours before
- An insurance policy, with coverage clearly identified as no less than
- Payment confirmation for no less than a 1-night stay upon arrival at the approved quarantine facilities or SHA Plus-certified hotel
- A Certificate of Vaccination (fully vaccinated)
- Undergo the entry screening upon arrival at Thailand's International
- Proceed directly with the approved airport transfer to the pre-arranged COVID-19 test center, or the reserved accommodation and undergo the required RT-PCR COVID-19 test on Day 0-1.
- Travellers must download and install the specified alert application
- If testing negative for COVID-19, travellers can go anywhere in Thailand!



Special Highlights

Khao Lak Surf Town


This place is developed to be the surfing hub of Thailand. With white sandy beaches and great waves, surfing for all levels is available here. Some surf spots are Nang Thong Beach, Kuek Kak Beach, 8 Fish Beach, Memories Beach, Laem Pakarang Beach, and Coconut Beach.



Phang Nga is the modern Thai, transliteration of the archaic Malay word pagan, literally 'jungle'. Located on the West side of the Malay Peninsula, here are some places to visit in Phang-Nga.

Khao Ping Kan

Sounds unfamiliar, this is one of the most famous islands in Phang Nga. It is distinguished by its 20-meter limestone rock islet called Koh Tapu. More famously known as James Bond Island where the film "The Man with The Golden Gun" featured it.





Surin Islands

This island consists of an archipelago of 5 islands and is also rated as one of the best diving sites in Phang Nga. The major drawcard for divers to the area is Richelieu Rock, a coral-covered pinnacle. For reasons still unknown, it attracts a fair number of whale sharks, which makes for exciting diving excursions.



Similan Islands

An archipelago of 11 islands in the Andaman Sea, 70 km off the coast in Phang Nga Province, this place is one of the best diving sites in Thailand. With a rich marine life consisting of hard and soft coral reefs, crystal clear waters, and white beaches, you might catch a glimpse of Manta Rays and Whale Sharks when snorkeling or diving there.



Experience the Talay Waek

A phenomenon called Talay Waek happens during low tide where it reveals a beach that connects 3 islands Chicken island, Mor island, and Tup island.



Phranang Cave Beach

One of the best rock climbing sites in the world and one of the most beautiful peninsulas in Thailand, is the highlight of Railay, with limestone mountains and cliffs.



Still staying in the south, Krabi will also be open fully to Malaysians this November. This time we will highlight a few places for you all to plan your next trip to Krabi.

Koh Phi Phi

Nui Bay




Natural Attraction: Chaeson National Park Lampang

Amazing Thailand Gastronomy

Thailand has long been known as the "rice bowl of Asia". As a staple diet of Thai people, rice is the soul of a Thai meal. The phrase "kin khao" literally translated to "eat rice" although the means to "eat food" or "have a meal".



Thai Jasmine Rice or Hom Mali

Popularly known as the rice of Thailand. This type of rice with natural fragrance and is available in both white and brown varieties. The long-grain rice with a glossy exterior is most commonly eaten.

Sticky Rice or Khao Niao

Khao Niao is literally translated as "sticky rice" and gets its name from how it looks and feels after it is cooked. This type of rice has shorter grained and has a combination of starches in it that makes it sticky. Often eaten with hands, Khao Niao has been the mainstay of Northern and Northeastern parts of Thailand.

Brown Rice or Khao Dum

Khao Dum has a reddish-black color and is slightly crunchy. The texture is from a bran layer of the grain that is left intact in the rice process. Brown rice is higher in fiber and also has a sticky rice version or Khao Niao Dum.
